1. Community Based Practices:

The Practice: The college **NSS** team (3 units) organizes Seven Days Special Camp for social service. They participate in various national, state and university level integration camps/workshops. During the Covid-19 pandemic, the volunteers distributed food packets & masks in various affected areas of Jaipur and also spread awareness about preventive measures. The College **NCC** Team (53 Boys & Girls) is linked with 1 Rajasthan Battalion **NCC**, Jaipur. **NCC** and **NSS** teams celebrate various important Days to spread awareness about different social issues as well as organize various One day camps and other programs for social awareness like awareness rallies on social issues, cultural performances, plantation, cleanliness programs, Wounded Bird Collection & Treatment Camp, blood donation camps, health awareness and checkup camps etc.
